Use an old shoe box as a base.

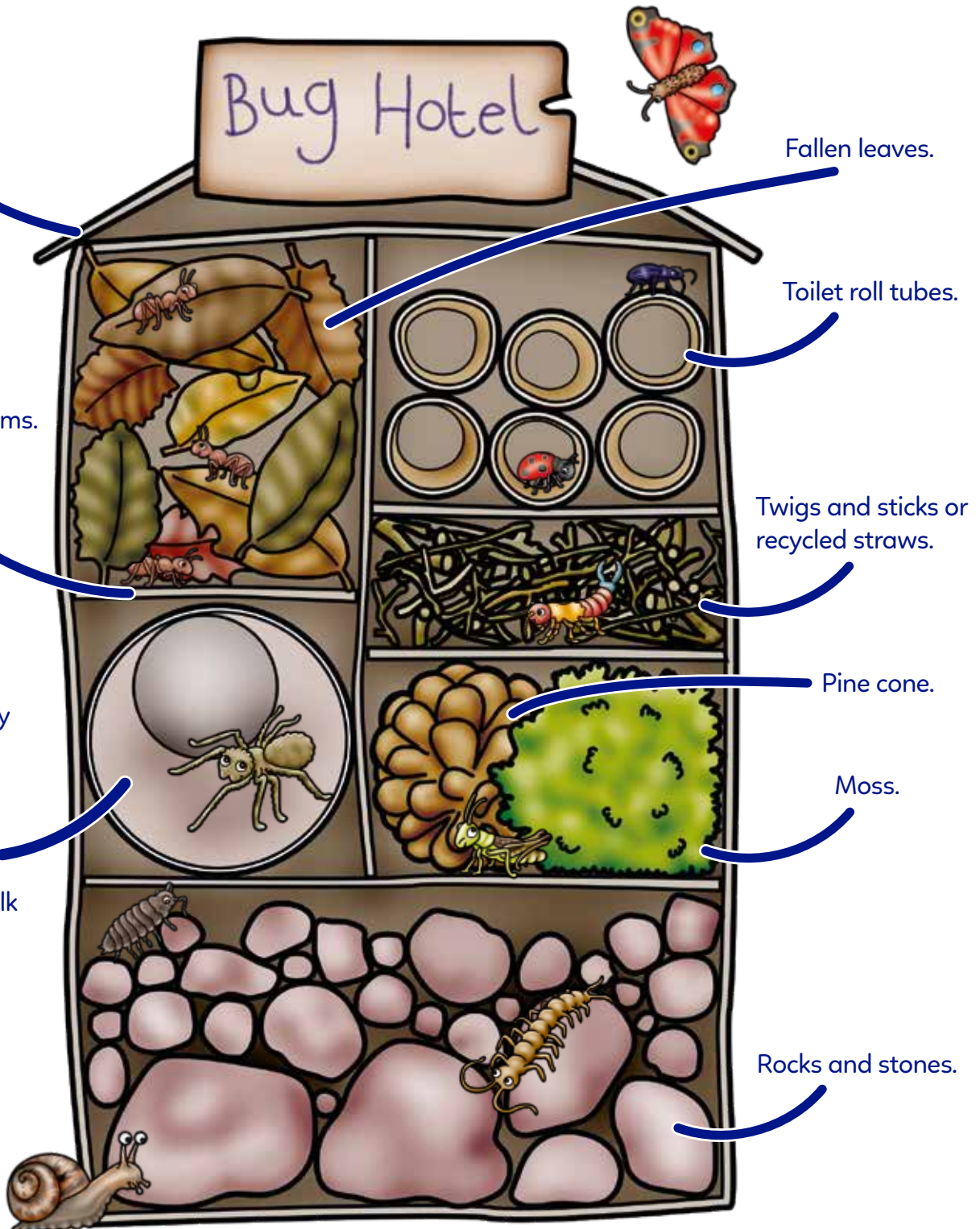
**2**
